Please note the most up to date FAQs:

Should I exchange money before I arrive in Ghana?

We suggest you wait and change your money in Ghana. Forex bureaus are everywhere, including at the airport near Carousel 1 of Baggage Claim. Make sure to carry new \$50 and \$100 bills for a better rate. They will not take it if there are pen marks or they are old notes.

My accommodation is Best Western Plus. What does Ground Transportation and Check In look like?

If you're staying at the Best Western Accra Beach Hotel, complimentary airport transfers are provided on your arrival and departure days. Upon arrival, look for a Best Western staff member holding an IBTS sign or wearing a Best Western Plus name tag in the arrivals area. They have received your flight information.

Please note: while the hotel provides ground transportation, individuals may also offer to assist with your luggage. If you accept this service, be prepared to tip as this is their expectation.

Hotel check-in begins at 2:00 PM. While early check-in is not guaranteed, if your room is ready, you'll be welcomed in. Otherwise, the hotel can safely store your luggage, and you are welcome to explore. Feel free to ask the front desk for taxi assistance.

ABOUT THE IBTS

In June 1996, Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright <u>August Wilson</u> delivered his now-famous keynote, <u>The Ground on Which I Stand</u>, at the Theatre Communications Group's annual conference. This powerful address, hailed as "a critical Black theatre manifesto" (Harry Elam Jr., <u>American Theatre</u>, <u>June 2016</u>), sparked a groundbreaking conversation about racial inequities in the theater world, addressing issues like casting, funding, and audience representation. The speech's impact led to public events including the debate between Wilson and American Repertory Theater Artistic Director Robert Brustein, moderated by Anna Deavere Smith at New York's Town Hall. Inspired by the momentum of this discourse, Dartmouth Theater Professors Victor Leo Walker II and William Cook, encouraged by Paul Carter Harrison, invited Wilson to collaborate on a major conference for Black theater professionals. Held at Dartmouth in March 1998, this historic gathering brought together luminaries like Ntozake Shange, Clinton Turner Davis, Robbie McCauley, Ricardo Khan, Thulani Davis, Ed Bullins and Woodie King Jr, and more, laying the foundation for the ongoing work of the Black Theatre Summit.

Rooted in the legacy of August Wilson's landmark 1998 *On Golden Pond* Black Theatre Summit, IBTS was reimagined in 2018 by Dr. Monica White Ndounou as a celebration and expansion of Wilson's vision. The 2018 gathering brought together industry leaders, scholar-artists, and practitioners to address the intersections of creativity and commerce in Black storytelling across theatre, film, and media.

IBTS Mission: The International Black Theatre Summit is a Think Tank, global network, and biennial convening that gathers scholars and practitioners working in theatre, film, television, and related media and tech to strategize the future of Black storytelling across platforms throughout the continent of Africa and the Diaspora.

Anchors

For some, this may be your first journey to The Motherland, and for others, it may not. We recognize that no matter where this trip exists on the continuum for you, you may encounter emotions, thoughts, feelings, or other intelligences that may need to be processed. To support you in your journey, we will daily identify two individuals in association with the IBTS team, who will serve as "Anchors" for you along your journey. Consider these "Anchors," friends, fellow journeyers available to hold space for you, process with you, and provide a kind of built-in kind of support for you as needed. They will be vigilant, available, and easily accessible for your support.

Additionally, throughout our time together there will be an alternative space made available for you to be used as a "quiet room" or "processing room" should the need arise. Feel free to utilize the space however best serves your digestion and processing.

Other Helpful Tips

- Money Exchange: We suggest you wait and change your money in Ghana. Forex bureaus are everywhere, including at the airport. Make sure to carry new \$50 and \$100 bills for a better rate. They will not take it if there are pen marks or they are old notes.
- <u>Do not receive or give with your left hand</u>: This is considered impolite/ disrespectful as that is the hand assigned to bathroom activities. If you decide to eat with your hands, also only use your right hand
- <u>Cash is preferred</u>: Outside of restaurants and brick and mortar shops, cash is preferred and likely your only option. There are ride-share apps such as Uber and Bolt available,

- but you should make sure you switch to cash. Carry clean \$50 and \$100 bills for exchange in Ghana.
- <u>Bartering</u>: Bartering is common and encouraged in outdoor market spaces. Pricing may begin higher if you are a tourist, but also keep in mind the privilege of the American dollar.
- Respect: Titles are very important, especially when speaking to elders. Always use "Mr." or Mrs." "Uncle" or "Auntie" can be used when there is a certain level of familiarity.
 "Please" is used not just for requests, but as a sign of respect. You may often hear it at restaurants. "Please, we are out of jollof."
- <u>Hydration</u>: Ghana is extremely humid. We highly recommend you stay well hydrated. There are no public fountains or refilling stations, so we highly recommend making sure having a filled water bottle on you before going out.

Note on Safety:

Being Queer in Ghana: The Executive Policies may cause fear, but please note they should not be of concern. If you do not trust that you in a safe, supportive environment, follow: No Kissing = No problem.

Traveling with Electronics: Fortunately, those in our network who have traveled between the US and Ghana have not had any issues with their devices searched or questions. If you are concerned, we understand, and encourage you to turn off your devices or turn on airplane mode, remove Face ID and/or remove any data that you'd like to keep protected before going through immigration.
